AMERICAS

UNITED STATES (FEDERAL)

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell announced that the Senate would begin negotiating the next COVID-19 relief package next week. Experts [predict](#)¹ that if the enhanced unemployment insurance benefits are not extended before they expire, payments will be delayed.

Several Senate Democrats [introduced](#)² the Economic Justice Act, a “\$350 billion aid for communities of color.” The proposal includes: \$215 billion for infrastructure, a homeowner down payment tax credit, expanding Medicaid, \$135 billion for jobs, childcare, mental health and primary care.

House Transportation and Infrastructure Chairman Peter A. DeFazio and Subcommittee on Aviation Chairman Rick Larsen are [leading](#)³ the distribution of a letter to colleagues that includes a draft letter to House and Senate leadership requesting the extension of the \$32 billion Payroll Support Program to keep airline employees on the payroll.

Representatives Ted Budd, Ralph Norman and John Larson introduced a [bill](#)⁴ that mandates the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) to conduct a pilot program for checking passengers’ temperatures at security checkpoints.

Senator Dianne Feinstein revealed that she will be proposing an [amendment](#)⁵ “to prohibit sending funds to states that haven’t adopted a statewide mask requirement.”

Acting Homeland Security Secretary Chad Wolf stated that the Department of Homeland Security would [extend](#)⁶ its prohibition on nonessential travel with Mexico and Canada through August 20, 2020.



UNITED STATES (STATE SPECIFIC)

As of 8am EST on July 17, 2020, there are 1,270 pending COVID-19 Legislations throughout 22 states. A total of 2,506 COVID-19 related bills have been enacted and proposed in the U.S. The high-level summaries are included below.

- Over 400 executive actions have been issued in 50 states, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, Guam, and the Virgin Islands. Over 1,500 executive actions have been issued in total
- Over 200 bills have been introduced in 43 state legislatures, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia on paid sick leave and worker protections as well as appropriations requests
- Over 30 states and the District of Columbia have issued emergency regulations on several issues including but not limited to insurance carriers, labor and wage, and medical licensure



As of July 16, 2020, at least 3 legislatures (California, Illinois and Nebraska) have postponed their legislative session.

UK

2020/07/16 Supporting UK Economic Recovery: Recapitalising Businesses Post COVID-19⁷

TheCityUK has published the Final Report of TheCityUK Recapitalisation Group (RCG) entitled 'Supporting economic recovery: recapitalising businesses post COVID-19'. The report is compiled in conjunction with HM Treasury, the Bank of England, the FCA, and business trade associations hailing from various businesses sectors and sizes. It warns of the need to take action to tackle the projected £35bn of unsustainable debt deriving from COVID-19 loans (ie the Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS), the Large Business Interruption Loan Scheme (LBILS) and the Bounce Back Loan Scheme (BBLs)), and sets out solutions for converting, restructuring and repaying this debt (in particular from the BBLs and CBILS). RCG has devised the options set out below to support recapitalisation:

- The UK Recovery Corporation: an entity dedicated to the recapitalisation process, which will provide the flexibility, efficiency and governance required to oversee the management of the proposed schemes. Chapter 5 of the Final Report sets out operating model options for this new entity.
- Business Repayment Plan (BRP): for small businesses, the BRP converts BBLs and small CBILS loans into a means-tested tax obligation, administered by HMRC with the operational support of the UK Recovery Corporation and repaid through the tax system.
- Business Recovery Capital (BRC): for SMEs with a CBILS loan, the BRC converts Government-guaranteed loans into subordinated debt or preferred share capital.
- Growth Shares for Business (GSB): for businesses that have viable growth prospects, but find their growth restricted by a lack of available funding, the GSB provides a mix of instruments (including preference shares) to provide growth capital to rebuild cash reserves, invest in working capital and relaunch after the pandemic.

2020/07/15 Business Interruption Insurance Test Case⁸

The FCA has updated its webpage on the High Court test case concerning business interruption (BI) insurance (claim no: FL-2020-000018). The FCA has published the Defendants' skeleton arguments (written submissions) for trial:

- Royal & Sun Alliance Insurance Plc skeleton argument.
- Zurich Insurance Plc skeleton argument.

The FCA has also published the Defendants' joint skeleton argument on the principles of contractual construction (interpretation) and Defendants' joint skeleton argument on causation (of loss).

2020/07/15 High-Cost Short-Term Credit Agreements and Coronavirus: Updated Temporary Guidance for Firms⁹

The FCA has updated its guidance on the financial situation of high-cost short-term credit agreement customers. On 24 April 2020, the FCA published guidance setting out its expectation that firms should provide, for a temporary period only, exceptional and immediate support to consumers facing payment difficulties due to circumstances arising out of coronavirus. The FCA published proposed revisions to this guidance on 3 July 2020. Following a short period for comments, the FCA has finalised its revised guidance which will provide continued support for users of high-cost short-term credit agreement products. The FCA is proposing to disapply some rules in order to give effect to this guidance.

2020/07/16 COVID-19: FCA and City of London Corporation Collaborate on Pilot of Digital Sandbox to Support Innovative Firms¹⁰

The FCA has published a press release announcing a collaboration with the City of London Corporation on the pilot of a 'digital sandbox' to support innovative firms tackling challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The organisations will work together to develop and launch a digital testing environment to provide innovative firms with access to high-quality data sets to allow for the testing and validation of technology solutions. In its pilot stage, the digital sandbox will support large financial institutions and start-ups looking to play a key role in the recovery from COVID-19 through supplying relevant data sets and expertise in three pressing areas:

- Detecting and preventing fraud and scams.
- Supporting the financial resilience of vulnerable customers.
- Improving access to finance for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).

The FCA states that applications to the digital sandbox will open later in summer 2020.

The People's Bank of China has decided, for the first time, to issue anti-epidemic government bonds for 2020 (four periods; 10-year term), tendering on July 21. The total face value of competitive bidding will be RMB 70 billion. Interest will be calculated beginning on July 16.
